History

Blithe Spirit was a thought that had been in Noël Coward's head for quite some time. He was eager to write a comedy play about ghosts and his first idea had the play set in an old house in Paris. It featured historical entities with the humour arising from their different attitudes and cultures. But this was not meant to be as he couldn't get the story to work in his mind.

It was while taking a short holiday in Snowdonia, after his London office had been destroyed in the Blitz, that the story finally began to take shape. He discussed the idea with his actress friend, Joyce Carey, for several hours one morning. With the general plot and character names now in his mind, he began writing the following morning. Six days later Blithe Spirit was finished.

The play first opened 16th June 1941 at the Manchester Opera House, just 43 days after the first word had been written. Shortly after, 2nd July 1941, it premiered at the Piccadilly Theatre in the West End. It then had its Broadway premier 5th November 1941. Noël Coward himself has both directed the play and taken on the role of Charles Condomine during its original London run and touring productions.

The play was made into a film in 1945 starring Rex Harrison with a very memorable performance by Margaret Rutherford, reprising her stage role, as Madame Arcati. Noël Coward provided the narration. The film went on to win the Academy Award for Best Visual Effects and is widely regarded as a classic.
